## II Eligibility

To be eligible to apply, applicants must meet all the requirements below.

### 1. Nationality : Non-Korean

- ※ Applicants and their parents must hold nationality (i.e., passport) of a country other than Korea. (Applicants who hold dual nationality, including Korean nationality, are not eligible to apply. If an applicant or either parent is found to have Korean nationality, the application will be disqualified, and admission will be revoked even after acceptance.)
- ※ Korean nationals with dual or multiple nationalities are not eligible to apply, including both the applicant and their parents.
- ※ Applicants who have acquired non-Korean nationality after birth are eligible only if the applicant and both parents have acquired the non-Korean nationality prior to the applicant's enrollment in an educational curriculum equivalent to the high school curriculum in Korea.
- ※ Applicants who themselves and/or their parents have ever held Korean nationality: Korean nationality of applicant and both parents must be renounced before the start of the application period.
- ※ Ewha Womans University accepts applications from female applicants only.

**[Notice Regarding Language Proficiency Requirements]**

- ※ Applicants admitted to undergraduate programs are required to acquire TOPIK level 4 or above before graduation. This requirement also applies to those admitted with proof of English language proficiency as their language requirement. (Exception: Division of International Studies)
- ※ The above language proficiency requirements are the minimum requirements for admission; being admitted with a certain language requirement does not mean that all courses at Ewha will be conducted in that language. With the exception of the Division of International Studies, the proportion of courses taught in English varies among majors and more courses may be taught in Korean than English.
- ※ In the Division of International Studies, all major courses are conducted in English; however, a number of mandatory liberal arts courses may be conducted in Korean.

**1. Quota**

Applicants will be selected through a comprehensive evaluation of their academic capability, language proficiency, preparedness in the chosen major, academic motivation, and other qualities demonstrated in their submitted materials.

## Required Documents

1. Documents that are not in Korean or English must be submitted with a certified translation into Korean or English, along with the original documents.
2. Once the online application process is complete, applicants will not be allowed to modify, replace, or cancel application or documents.
3. Upon being offered preliminary admission, all documents must be submitted as original hard copies. Submitted documents or records will NOT be returned to the applicant. If there are documents that can only be issued once and thus cannot be submitted as originals, copies certified by Ewha or the issuing institution are also acceptable.
4. Applicants may be asked to submit additional documents not listed in the “Required Documents” section of this admissions guide should further verification of the applicant’s eligibility be necessary.
